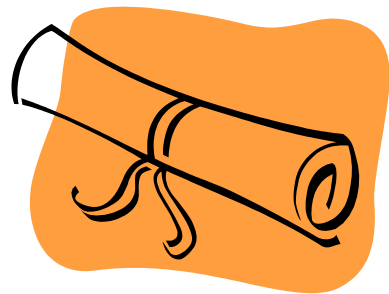


General Educational Development GED

Mature Students

- 19 years or older as of September 1
- May be eligible for retroactive credits
- Does not need to complete CALM or Physical Education to meet Diploma requirements
- If entered high school prior to 1994-1995 may meet the requirements that were in effect for the year they were in high school

TYPES OF DIPLOMAS

Alberta High School Diploma

This is the diploma that most high school students receive.

Requirements:

100 Credits

English 30-1 or 30-2

Social 30-1 or 30-2

Math 20 level

Science 20 level

Physical Education 10 (3 credits)

CALM (3 credits)

10 credits in any combination:

- Career & Technology Studies (CTS)
- Fine Arts
- Physical Education 20 and/or 30
- Knowledge and Employability courses
- Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) courses

10 Additional 30 level credits



Certificate of High School Achievement

These are the minimum requirements for a student to obtain a Certificate of High School Achievement. The requirements for entry into post secondary institutions and workplaces may require additional and/or specific courses.

80 Credits

English 20-2 or 30-4

Math 10-3 or 20-4

Science 14 or 20-4

Social Studies 10-2 or 20-4

Physical Education 10 (3 credits)

CALM (3 credits)

5 credits in:

- 30 Level Knowledge and Employability occupational course or;
- 30 Level CTS

AND

5 credits in:

- 30-Level knowledge and Employability Workplace Practicum Course or;
- 30-Level Work Experience course or;
- 30-Level Green Certificate Course

OR

5 credits in a RAP Course

High School Equivalency Diploma

Available to students 18 or older who have been out of school for at least 10 consecutive months.

Alternative 1

- A minimum of 60 credits must be gained through accredited instruction, as follows:

5 credits in high school math

3 credits in high school science

5 credits English 30-1 or 30-2

5 credits in one other 30 level course

42 credits in other high school courses

Additional credits to add to a total of 100 from:

- * Additional high school course
- * Additional approved adult education course
- * Maturity (5 credits for age 21-24; 10 credits age 25-29; 15 credits for age 30 and over)
- * 5 credits for extensive travel
- * 5 credits for extensive reading

Alternative 2

Anyone 18 or older, who has been out of school for 10 consecutive months, who passes all 5 tests in the General Educational Development (GED) test battery with a score of 450 or better in each test and meets the eligibility requirements will be granted a High School Equivalency Diploma.
